Chairman King wanted to reflect on the many lives lost over the last few months, hurricane after hurricane, mass shooting, the wildfires and Police Officers from Sommerville and Webster. He asked for a Moment of Silence

Motion to approve the one-day license made by Selectman Krumsiek, seconded by Selectman Cristo.

Motion carried unanimously.

Ishmal Rodrigues: Flee's Cupcakes- 26A Main Street- Mr. Rodrigues said that he will be selling coffee, pastry, cupcakes, and breakfast items. Selectman Cristo asked if he bakes all of his own pastry. Yes, he does. She then asked if he had been in business before. No, he has not. Steve Balistreri said that his cupcakes are out of this world!

Motion to approve the Common Victualler License pending Board of Health and Building department signoff made by Selectman Krumsiek, seconded by Selectman Cristo. Motion carried unanimously.

Town Manager Report:

Mr. Marciello wanted to address an anonymous letter who complained about our Police Chief doing a detail- He does not do investigations on anonymous complaints, but he wanted to address this. The Chief of Police did a detail at the block party. He followed protocol, offered to everyone on the list, he volunteers so much of his own time to this town, Mr. Marciello has no problem with the Chief doing a detail.

Mr. Marciello is appointing James F. Kelley as the Human Resources Director. Selectman Despres ask if the new office is ready for use. It will be done soon, if not by Monday, just a day or two after that. Chairman King asked if the offices will interfere with the heating/AC. Mr. Marciello said that he and Mr. Frederico designed the offices so that they would have a heater

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and a return. Selectman Krumsiek asked about a case that comes up when you google Mr. Kelley. Mr. Marciello said that there was a court case he was involved in; he was an acting town administrator at the time; he was the liquor license agent in that town and the Chief of Police thought that he interfered with someone getting a license. The case was dismissed. He is willing to discuss it with anyone. He will be coming to our next meeting.

Motion to concur with the appointment James F. Kelley as the Human Resource Director made by Selectman Krumsiek, seconded by Selectman Cristo.

Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent Greg Myers said that he followed up with the superintendent in Stoughton; it is good to have someone with that much experience for our brand new department. He will build this from the ground up as he has been there, done that.

Mr. Marciello is appointing Keith Nastasia and Paul Stringham to the Energy Advisory Committee.

Motion to concur with the appointments made by Selectman Krumsiek, seconded by Selectman Cristo.

Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Marciello would like to discuss ongoing negotiations with the Finance Director in executive session as well as discussing the recreational marijuana laws as it relates to our host agreement and future marijuana at that facility.

The stair project is complete; they will be sealed and caulked weather permitting.

The RAC is meeting now; Mr. Nastasia put out quotes for a small side road so we can get one road done before the plants close. The bids will be ready and out so that as soon as 'winter' clears, paving can start.

Mr. Marciello met with WS Development, Katie Wetherbee, regarding Phase 2 money for the McCracken Road TIP project.

He met with Weston & Sampson, the DPW Director and the Planner. Town are only mandated to do work in an area that is urbanized or a watershed area that needs remediation. Because we are right outside of Worcester, we are urbanized; because we have the River and the Lakes - everywhere else. We do not have to do best practices in West Millbury; but it would be fool hardy not to protect our aquafer. Year 1 we have to spend \$80-90,000; Years 2-10 we are looking at \$300,000/year.

Selectman Krumsiek went to a MMA meeting today and the Town of Dighton uses molasses over the salt so that it sticks to the ground.

Ramshorn Dam spillway railings are in. Guard rails are coming in Monday/Tuesday. Posts in next week. Tarring will be done and road open by November. There will be a temporary fence along the wall until the new fence comes in.

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He did have a Cell Tower Overlay District meeting. They will be Wednesdays at 7:00 pm.

Chairman King asked where we are on Round Pond. One is in litigation regarding the ownership and the other one is an ownership question as well. Mr. Marciello said that the DPW budget is going to get bigger this year as we have roads, culverts, bridges and many other things that need to be done.

Mr. Marciello said that a \$1.5 million debt exclusion would add \$254/year on an average home (\$258,000). He has spoken to Grafton's Town Manager, Tim McInerney. He said that you wouldn't want to spend \$8 million at once. Mr. Marciello would like to use like a "home equity line of credit". The selectmen would have to vote to use the line of credit. It is like a \$1 million credit card that the selectmen can use for roads/bridges, big project, etc. Grafton has been doing this since 2014. Chairman King asked if Mr. McInerney would come to our next meeting.

61A 13 Stone Road*attached- the cemetery commission does not have the money to buy the land so they are not interested in it. Selectman Krumsiek asked if this could be a big development? Yes, it could. Mr. Marciello said that there is value in buying any open space in the town, maybe we should start up a community preservation committee.

Motion to deny our right of first refusal made by Selectman Despres for the property located at 13 Stone Road, Worcester Registry of Deeds in Book 57392, Page 258 and Board of Accessors Map 66 Lot 26 Lot 6R, seconded by Selectman Krumsiek.

Motion carried unanimously.

Plastic Bag Ban- the Recycling Education Committee will be meeting at the end of the month to discuss this.

Selectman Cristo asked if the crack sealing is being done.


