Call to order at 6:30pm

Karyn Clark Deputy Town Manager spoke to the Commission—to introduce herself, now that she is the "acting" Town Manager. She wanted to let them know she is available to help in any way she can during the transition. She gave a brief back round on her career and said if they have any questions or concerns to contact her office.

NOI for 37 Benton St:

Chairman Stead Opened the Hearing. Norman Hill from Land Planning spoke on behalf of Jim Tomaiolo stating that they plan to build a single-family home on a 1-acre lot. Agent Flynn did a site visit to the location and stated that Mr. Hill adequately described the area. Also, Agent Flynn stated his observation that the area immediately adjacent to the wetlands has been filled in the distant past, not sure when. Mr Hill and Agent Flynn agreed on filling the area with wood chip mulch and jute netting, to stabilize the fill and require at least one wetland sign. Agent will add these to OOCs. MA DEP file number not yet issued.

Jeffrey Raymond motioned to continue to October 4, 2023, Mathew Ashmankas seconded, Voted in favor unanimously.

Eagle Scout project; Bike Repair Station, Brierly Pond Conservation Area

Chairman Stead opened the meeting. Jacob Decatur, Eagle Scout candidate from Troop 22 of Worcester presented his project for Eagle Scout badge. He proposes a bike repair station for the Brierly Pond Conservation Trail. Jacob gave a presentation of the project of the repair station. If he gets approval from the Commission his deadline would be this December before the ground hardens and the snow falls. Discussion of project details and visual diagrams were presented. Bruce DeVault of the Millbury Trails Committee provided additional details and sponsorship coordination. Mathew Ashmankas made a motion to approve the Bike Repair Station at Brierly Pond Conservation, Christopher Weagle seconded the motion. all in favor, Voted in favor unanimously.

30 Shore Terrace: Certificate of Compliance MADEP File 224-0785:

Chairman Stead Opened the Meeting. John Prohaska was present to discuss the project. He stated he had completed the project and the open lot now had a well-established lawn cover, but he had a great deal of difficulty. Eradicating the Japanese knotweed as required by the OOCs. He stated there was a patch remaining near the property boundary with his other parcel. Agent Flynn was recognized by the Chairman and offered that there were patches of knotweed along the waterfront but, that, perhaps the landowner would continue efforts to eradicate it after the COC was granted. Christopher Weagle made the motion to approve, Jeffrey Raymond Second, Mathew Ashmankas abstained. Motion to approve carried.
