Introducing a new Library of Things in February for Tweens and Teens - Break-in Bags (original idea was found by Carrie from an out of state library) Kaitlin and I thought it was a great idea. Purchased the bags and locks. Kaitlin put together the bags before she left. Carrie cataloged them. There are 3 to start - Zombies, Animals, and Puffabird. They will be offered to Millbury residents for the first 4 weeks.

Door decorating Contest - top votes, first place the Gingerbread Door by one vote, Gnomes was the very close second, and Train came in third.

January yoga class postponed due to no registrants and COVID.

COVID update

Many libraries are canceling in person programs for January and canceling use of meeting spaces.

As of Jan 6 - we have 17 groups scheduled mostly Girl Scouts in our meeting spaces. Sean will support whatever decision we make about keeping the library open or closed. Not granting any new reservation rooms for the rest of January.

Rescheduled the yoga class.

Traffic of patrons is slow. Hardly anyone in library from 6-8PM.

There was discussion on the topic of the library remaining open and no action was taken: The Library remains open.

Ann asked about the renewal of her contract. **Stephanie, Ann and Sean** are working on the best way to move forward. This includes, canvasing other library director's contracts and looking at the contract language so that all party's interests are adequately represented. Copy machine feeder is jammed - getting repaired soon.

Our Children and Craft Rm walls have been repaired. In two weeks the flooring will be completed. Vendor had to order it. Coming from Washington DC.
