ARTICLE 1: To hear the reports of several Town Officers and Committees, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

ARTICLE 2: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from available funds, such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses and charges of the Town of Millbury in Fiscal Year 2022, the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, including, but not limited to: the salaries of Town Officers, costs of public education, debt and interest payments, expenses of the Sewer Enterprise Fund, and providing municipal services, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

FISCAL YEAR 2022 CONSENT AGENDA-RECURRING BUSINESS

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$500.00 from Account #02.945.5200.02062.2021.500 to be used by the Town Manager to settle claims for personal property damage or incidental personal injury claims that may be brought against the Town, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$5,000.00 from Account # 02.945.5200.02068.2021.500 to pay for the disposal of abandoned property, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 to fund an Elders Community Services Program for the purpose of providing a payment voucher for services rendered for the departments, boards and committees of the municipality to resident property owners who have attained the age of sixty (60) years, to be used to reduce the real estate property taxes for the property in which the elderly owner resides; said program shall be subject to the following conditions, in addition to any and all eligibility requirements promulgated by the Board of Selectmen, after receiving the recommendations of the Council on Aging: (a) participation in the program shall be limited to elderly residents of the Town who own property and are willing and able to provide services to the Town; (b) program participants shall receive compensation at a rate of \$8.00 an hour for each hour of service rendered for a total not to exceed \$1,500.00 in any calendar year; (c) program participants must agree in writing prior to participating in the program to receive compensation in the form of a voucher to be presented to the Treasurer/Tax Collector to be applied to the real estate obligations of the participant for the property in

which the participant resides; (d) the Treasurer/Tax Collector shall comply with the wage, tax and payroll deduction requirements of the state Department of Revenue and the federal Internal Revenue Service prior to compensating program participants or applying the net amount of wages earned to the real estate tax obligations of the participants; and (e) program participants who meet the eligibility guidelines established for the program by the Board of Selectmen shall be selected for participation in the program on a first-come, first-served basis, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen and Council-On-Aging) (Required Vote: Majority)

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the PEG Access and Cable Related Fund the sum of \$215,765.00 for the expenses of Public Access as follows, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

FISCAL YEAR 2022 NEW APPROPRIATIONS

ARTICLE 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, borrow, or otherwise provide the sum of \$725,000, or any other sum, to pave or repave various public ways in the Town, including any necessary road, drainage, bridge, or culvert improvements, or other appurtenant improvements, improvements to Public Works buildings and structures, and including all engineering, permitting, or other incidental costs; and to meet said appropriation authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7, of the Massachusetts General Laws, or any other authority, to borrow up to the sum of said appropriation; or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Two-Thirds Majority)

Rationale: Funding for continuing infrastructure repairs including potential salt shed construction costs and engineering costs for culverts (West Main Street). All other unexpended funds will be utilized as part of the paving program.

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$210,402.00 to the Stabilization Fund, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority) **Rationale:** According to the Town's Financial Reserve/Free Cash Policy, the Town will use Free Cash to add to the Stabilization Fund with the goal of maintaining in that fund an amount equal to 10% of the total projected general fund operating revenues for the next fiscal year. With this transfer, Stabilization will be at approximately \$1,900,000, which is approximately four percent of projected FY2022 revenues.

ARTICLE 11: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$105,201.00 to the OPEB Trust account, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority) Rationale: According to the Town's Financial Reserve/Free Cash Policy, the Town will use five percent (5%) of each year's Free Cash to add to the OPEB Trust fund in order to reach the Town's actuarial accrued liability. With this transfer, the OPEB Trust fund balance will be approximately \$310,000.

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$100,000.00 to the Chapter 90 Supplement account, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

Rationale: According to the Town's Financial Reserve/Free Cash Policy, the Town will use 20% of each year's Free Cash or \$100,000 to supplement Chapter 90 receipts.

ARTICLE 13: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$50,000 to the Road Infrastructure Stabilization account, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

Rationale: According to the Town's Financial Reserve/Free Cash policy, the Town may use Free Cash to add to other reserve or trust funds. With this transfer, the Road Infrastructure Stabilization balance will be approximately \$160,000.

ARTICLE 14: To see if the town will vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$50,000 to the Health Insurance Stabilization account, or take any other action

Rationale: According to the Town's Financial Reserve/Free Cash policy, the Town may use Free Cash to add to other reserve or trust funds. With this transfer, the Health Insurance Stabilization balance will be approximately \$300,000.

ARTICLE 15: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$150,000.00 to the Compensated Absences Reserve Fund, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

Rationale: Municipal employees are eligible for payment of unused paid time off (sick and vacation) when they leave the service of the Town. There is no dedicated funding source for this reserve, and the amount either needs to be budgeted for an anticipated retirement or appropriated from Free Cash by Town Meeting. This fund allows the town to proactively plan for retirements.

ARTICLE 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer the following sums from available funds for any or all of the following capital improvement projects and purchases, or take any other action thereon. (Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: Majority)

Rationale: According to the Town's Financial Reserve/Free Cash policy, the Town may use Free Cash to fund capital improvements or general non-recurring expenditures. If all the Free Cash requests on this warrant are approved, the Free Cash balance will be approximately \$155,000.

(Board of Selectmen) (Required Vote: 2/3rds Majority)

Rationale: The Commonwealth's Department of Local Services informed the Town that while Town Meeting's acceptance of MGL Chapter 40, Section 5B stands as lawful and appropriate, the conditional and/or discretionary allocation language is impermissible under the statute.
