- Based on a proposed 60/40-school/town split
 - Schools will reduce \$207k from their expenditures
 - Town has reduced expenditures by \$138k

General Government Decreases from \$1,502,736 to \$1,481,452

• an decrease of \$21,284 or -1.42%

 due mainly to new computer services and reductions in the elections budget

Public Safety decreases from \$2,779,639 to \$2,767,902

• a decrease of \$11,737 or .42%

 Public Education Increases from \$17,754,000 to \$18,090,465
\$336,465, or 1.9% increase for Millbury

Public Schools

 Public Works Increased from \$1,556,177 to \$1,671,859
an increase of \$115,682 or 7.4%

Public Health & Human Services increased from \$381,113 to \$408,402

• an increase of \$27,289 or 7.16%

 Culture and Recreation increases from \$403,564 to \$407,775
a decrease of \$4,211 or 1.04%

 Debt Service Decreased from \$2, 613,071 to \$2,511,335
a decrease of 101,736 or -3.89%

 Employee Benefits Increased from \$ 5,648,240 to \$5,956,456
an increase of \$318,216 or 5.63%

General Insurances increase to \$335,000

 Sewer Enterprise increases from \$1,214,561 to \$1,392,937
an increase of \$178,376 or 14.69%
